San Francisco and our most vulnerable residents continue to deal with the ongoing reality of climate change and the severe weather patterns it has brought with it. San Francisco is and must remain a global leader in environmental justice and green innovation. I strongly believe in the Green New Deal and that San Francisco should guarantee the accessibility of green spaces to all.

Trevor's Plan:

- **Fully implement the [SF Climate Action Plan](#), and meet all goals of [Chapter 9 of the SF Environment Code](#).**
- **Fully fund San Francisco's Climate Equity Hub.** Fully electrify our buildings and appliances with a complete conversion to a 100% renewable energy for both electricity and transport by 2030, with full de-carbonization of the economy by 2040.
- **Increase the placement of trash cans** in D9's busiest commercial corridors such as San Bruno Avenue, Cortland Avenue, Mission Street and Valencia Street to reduce litter and waste in our streets and comply with the City's Zero Waste goals.
- **Increase our tree canopy** through expanded partnerships with community groups, support from Friends of the Urban Forest, and securing funding to add much needed vegetation.
- **Invest in climate rehabilitation**, training and hiring workers within these communities by providing robust financial incentives to businesses.
- **Weatherize homes and businesses** with sliding-scale grants for low and moderate income families and small businesses.
- **Protect our wetlands** with sufficiently treated waste water to prevent further algae blooms and fish kill. We must also ensure our wetlands have sufficient sediment and open shorelines so they can survive increased flooding and severe weather caused by climate change.
- **Increase green space in underserved neighborhoods.** Current funding streams for community greening favor well-resourced neighborhoods with the resources to raise matching requirements which can be high as 35%. These need to be made more accessible to underserved neighborhoods.
